

Accounting T Level Level 3

The T Level in Accounting offers a specialised focus on the role of an Assistant Accountant. During this 2-year program, students acquire core knowledge and skills necessary for various accounting occupations. You will engage in independent or group work to solve accounting problems. You will research and devise innovative solutions to business issues, presenting your findings to the group. Additionally, you will have the opportunity to apply your skills during the work placement.

You can progress into roles such as:

- Payroll Administrator
- Payroll junior
- Assistant Accountant
- Payroll Officer
- Account clerk
- Cashier finance assistant
- Purchase ledger clerk
- And many more

The course is scheduled over 4 days per week and will be a mixture of theory and practical lessons.

You will also complete an industry placement for 45 days with an employer in the setting.

The UK's Accounting Sector has been performing strongly in recent years.

Top accountancy firms have seen significant growth, despite challenging global economic conditions. In 2022, they saw their average fee income rise by 15.5%, exceeding the 8.3% growth registered in 2021.

The number of UK accountancy jobs has also increased, rising to almost 450,000 in 2021 – up 13% from 2017 and compared to a 3% increase for all sectors.

- 5 GCSEs at Grades 4 (C) or above, or equivalent, all from the core subjects including grade 5 in GCSE maths and GCSE 4 in English Language.

To further enhance your progression, you will actively participate in skills competitions, such as the Big Idea Challenge and Skills London.
You will have opportunities to take part in trips and visits, such as the Association of Accounting Technicians Conference.
You will have access to key employers that will deliver guest lectures to build your industry knowledge and create your future, including those from NatWest.

All students must complete a minimum of 9 weeks/45 days working with an employer/s on an industry placement.

T Levels are designed for university or apprenticeship pathways and prepare students for highly skilled roles in

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accounting and payroll.

Completion of the T Level course will allow you to progress onto:

- Higher Level Apprenticeship
- Higher National Diploma
- Employment

T Levels are eligible for UCAS tariff points equivalent to A Levels and most universities recognise T Levels as equal in merit.
