

Diploma in Bricklaying Level 2

This course is designed for persons aged 16+. This qualification will allow you to develop your skills further as a bricklayer and teach you construction technologies.

Entry Requirements

The entry requirements for this course are:

- 4 GCSEs at Grade 3(D) or above including English and Maths or Progression from a Level 1 Diploma in Brickwork course
- You will be required to attend an informal interview which may include completing an assessment based on your prior qualifications

What will I study?

This course consists of the following modules:

- Health and safety / tool identification. Carry out safe working practices in construction
- Handle and store materials
- Setting out
- Constructing walling detail
- Health and safety
- How to handle equipment and build brick/block and cavity walls

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed via:

- Observation of your practical work by a Qualified Assessor
- Your industry knowledge will be assessed by short question papers, which will take place throughout your programme of study
- You will be required to pass two multiple-choice external online examinations
