

Childcare CACHE Diploma Level 1

This course is designed for 16-19 and 19+ year olds.

This course will provide you with an understanding of the skills and knowledge required to progress. This is Year 1 (Level 1) of a 2 Year (Level 2) course. Upon successful completion, you will have the option to progress to a Level 2 in Childcare or Health & Social Care.

Our Childcare and Health and Social Care Course is an introductory course for people interested in working in Early Years and/or Health and Social Care settings.

Throughout this course you will be trained and assessed to achieve a CACHE qualification as well as receive a minimum of 36 hours work experience in a childcare or health and social care environment. The course is scheduled over 3-4 days per week.

Progression opportunities

Your progression from this qualification will be either:

- Health and Social Care Level 2 course
- Childcare Level 2 course
- Level 2 Apprenticeship
