Entry Requirements

The entry requirements for this course are:

- You must hold a minimum of a Level 3 in the subject you want to teach which you need to evidence by showing relevant certificates.
- You also need to have studied to Level 2 in English and maths. Certificates to level 2 or GCSE grade 9 (A*) to 4 (C) are preferable.
- You will be required to attend an informal interview which may include completing an assessment based on your prior qualifications.

What will I study?

The course consists of the following modules:

- The role of the tutor and the interrelationships with other professionals
- Referral systems
- The characteristics and aspirations of the adult learner
- Methods and resources used in adult classes

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed via:

- Written assignments
- 4 journals at the end of each assignment
- Micro-teaching for 20 mins (self-evaluation, tutor observation and peer assessment)
