Teaching Assistant Level 2 (Day)

The Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Level 2 course is designed for 19+ adults.

The purpose of STALIS is to train qualified and competent teaching assistants, who would like to work or are already working in a primary, secondary school or college as a teaching or learning support assistant and are seeking professional accreditation for their specialist skills.

Learners achieve their main qualification plus additional qualification towards positive attributes of a teaching assistant to move forward in their teaching profession.

Learners develop skills in behaviourism, professionalism, communication, first aid, safeguarding, career talks, mock interviews, CV writing and L1 Employability.

The course runs over 4 hours per week. We offer child friendly hours or an evening.

Sector Overview

Working in education can be incredibly rewarding. - You will be required to attend an informal interview which may include completing an assessment based on your prior qualifications
